

## The Gift of Transformation

This is the story of Gift, the newest Shaping Destiny child brought into our orphanage, told by one of our incredible volunteers, Sunny. Sunny got to witness this malnourished and underweight child rescued from a life of hopelessness to a healthy life filled with joy and hope!

It's always a blessing when a new child is welcomed into the Shaping Destiny family. Whether they are toddlers or teenagers, being sponsored opens countless doors to education and resources that may have been inaccessible. I was fortunate enough to experience the joy of integrating children into the Shaping Destiny Center while I was in Cameroon from June to December of last year. I remember that day distinctly, not because of how hot it seemed to be or how many trips to the spring it took to fill our water drums, what caught my attention was the unfamiliar voice I heard that evening. As per usual, the children were doing homework in the room that I shared with Jackie, the orphanage director. The older kids were hard at work with long division and sentence construction and the younger ones were enjoying working out the simple arithmetic problems that we gave them. As I entered the room, I saw him: a young boy named Gift who had been chosen as a sponsor child. He didn't seem interested in playing, he was observant but shy. The first

thing I noticed was how tiny he was, his mobility was limited to sitting up or standing with the aid of a chair or a hand. His hair was discolored and falling out and his skin had a sickly yellow tint to it. His stomach was swollen, a sign of malnourishment. I was taken aback by the state he was in; it seemed as though he came to the center just in time. I guessed that he couldn't be more than a year and a half old, he was so small. I began to talk to him, as you do with babies, and almost fell over when he began talking back.

"Ahhhhh! A talking baby!"



As it turns out, seventeen pound Gift was three years old. His condition didn't seem too promising. Gift has been receiving medical care, food, attention, and lots of love at the Shaping Destiny center for over four months and his condition has improved dramatically. His hair and skin is healthy, he is getting regular checkups at the hospital, he is running and dancing with his new friends, and there is seldom a time when you can't see his beautiful smile or hear his infectious laughter.

It is an incredible and moving experience seeing such an incredible transformation in such a short period of time. Our God is a God who loves transformation. One of the most prominent examples in creation is that of metamorphosis. A puny little worm thing wraps himself in some thread that is essentially glorified spit and emerges as one of the most beautiful and graceful creatures in nature. Granted, the in between phase might be less than comfortable for the caterpillar but it pays off in the end. Sometimes, transformation requires us to get a little uncomfortable. God might not ask you to hang upside down and wrap yourself in your own fibrous saliva, come to think of it, I don't think he ever asks people to do that, but he might ask you to make a sacrifice; to get uncomfortable for a little while. A caterpillar could walk around and be comfortable on the ground, hanging out with the worms and the millipedes, but he'll never find out what the glory of flying feels like until he gets a little sticky.

Our sponsors have chosen to make a sacrifice for the sake of transforming the lives of children halfway across the planet. Without their generosity, stories like Gift's wouldn't be possible. Maybe sponsoring a child through Shaping Destiny didn't seem possible at first; still, you answered the call to action and blessed children who desperately needed it. We want to thank all those who support Shaping Destiny in so many ways for all of the transformation that has been made possible through their support.

The nations threatened by Boko Haram, including Chad, Cameroon, and Nigeria, are fighting back; however, the group is still active and fiercely opposed to the education being given in schools in Africa. While these things are out of our own control, we serve the One who is in control of everything. We ask you to join us in praying for Cameroon and the nations being threatened by Boko Haram. Pray for those that have been taken hostage and their families, pray for the families of those who have died, pray for wisdom for political leaders and for the Boko Haram members. # A Step Made in Faith

Meet Sunny, a young girl from Oregon who came to volunteer last year with Shaping Destiny in Cameroon. It was such a joy to see her grow in her faith, in her perspective, and in her worldview on orphan care. Although she is young, she is wise beyond her years and has quickly become a close friend to our ministry and a wonderful success story to our volunteer program. Her time spent overseas was a blessing, not only to her, but to our ministry as well. This is her story...

Eight months ago, I got on a plane to Cameroon. Not just one plane, a series of planes. That's usually how international flights work. I had a couple layovers in Europe; not long enough to see anything cool but long enough to say that "I've kind of been to France". I returned to the US two

months ago, right before Christmas. Culture shock is bad enough when you come back in the summer, try being exposed to the most commercialized holiday ever right after six months of dirt roads and dried fish. Since I've come back, people have asked me a myriad of questions. Some of them are really difficult to answer; most of them are impossible to answer. Still, I stumble my way through a response. By far the most common question I have been asked is "how was Africa?" I'm going to let you guys in on a secret: I have no idea how to answer that. I could say it was good but that's a very general

statement. Honestly, it wasn't always good. I didn't go to Africa to have a good time; I went so that God could use me to do something outside of myself. I went to learn and to work and to grow. I did those things. I learned more than I could have ever imagined I would. I worked harder than I thought I could. I grew in knowledge of who I was and who God is. In the midst of being there, as close as I could be to children in need, I realized that God had something for me to accomplish back home; so I got on another plane and I went again. Through all of the changes and the difficulties, I am still reaching out for



something infinitely more important than my comfort, my wants, or myself. I am pursuing the will and the purpose of my creator. I am stepping back and following His lead. Our society often recoils at words such as "submission" or "surrender" but they are such beautiful concepts if we understand them. Surrendering to God's will is a choice, oftentimes it's an uncomfortable one. The first time I went to Africa I was in the midst of an intense battle with fear. Anxiety ruled my life, but I knew that God was asking me to do something that I knew I wasn't capable of in and of myself. My fear didn't go

away until I got on the airplane. I was acting contrary to what my circumstance was telling me. We all have circumstances in life that seem insurmountable. Maybe it's finances, broken relationships, or an illness. Still, we are told to walk by faith and not by sight. How freeing it is when we yield to the truth of who God is in the midst of the chaos around us. He doesn't call the equipped, He equips the called. I encourage you to follow God's plan for your life even if your circumstances say no. You can walk a million miles, but the step that you make in faith will bring you farther than you've ever gone before.

#### Learn How to Start an Orphanage

Austin Bible Institute is offering a course on *How* to Start an Orphanage. This introductory course is designed to be a first step in equipping students who feel called to serve orphans, start an orphan care organization or orphanage. They are taught how to discover and write their purpose, mission and vision statements, establish core values, develop strategies, set initial goals, write a business plan, select initial board members, choose a name for the organization and incorporate or register with their state government. The course will cover everything that a student needs to go from their dream to launching their new organization. In addition to that, it will introduce students to other

recommended courses at Austin Bible Institute that they can take to further prepare themselves to achieve their goal of running an orphan care organization effectively. With exegesis of biblical passages students are challenged to personally examine motives and confirm their call to serve orphans. The focus of this course will be on starting an orphan care ministry, not running it. Students will be directed to other courses at Austin Bible Institute that will prepare them to effectively run the organization that this course teaches them how to start.
